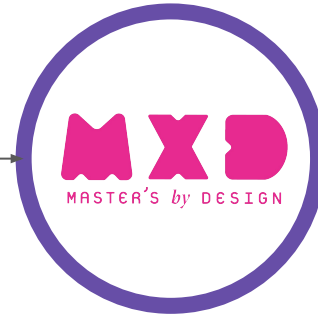

Research question:

How can design help Gainesville youth engage in conversations about their perceptions of wellness, safety and community?

Although the unemployment rate for young Americans ages 16-24 is twice the national average, **nearly 75% of our graduates enter the workforce or post-secondary education immediately after graduation.**



Statistically, only 16% of high school dropouts who return to school end up earning their diploma. However, **93% of Project YouthBuild students have earned their HS Diploma.**



Over 60% of Project YouthBuild students have been involved in the criminal justice system as juveniles or adults prior to enrollment. Defying the statistics, **the recidivism rate for Project YouthBuild graduates is less than 6%.**
