Research question:

How can design help Gainesville youth engage in conversations about their perceptions of wellness, safety and community?







Although the unemployment rate for young Americans ages 16-24 is twice the national average, nearly 75% of our graduates enter the workforce or post-secondary education immediately after graduation.



Statistically, only 16% of high school dropouts who return to school end up earning their diploma. However, 93% of Project YouthBuild students have earned their HS Diploma.



Over 60% of Project YouthBuild students have been involved in the criminal justice system as juveniles or adults prior to enrollment. Defying the statistics, the recidivism rate for Project YouthBuild graduates is less than 6%.






